

Board of Trustees Update

Key Items from the April Trustees meeting:

- At Wynn Davies' request, transfer of funds from the Fuguitt bequest to a dedicated fund under Outreach Ministries titled "Fuguitt Social Justice Fund" was approved.
- The Trustees approved an additional transfer of funds from the Fuguitt bequest, allocating portions to both the Uncommitted Capital Reserve and the Trustee Fund, with the latter specifically earmarked for upgrading the sanctuary sound system.
- The rental manager position has reached the interview stage.
- The ADA (automatic swing) door has been installed.
- The lateral pipelines running from the church to the summer road work site were inspected and found to be in good condition—no replacement needed (phew!).
