Are Electric Vehicles Green?

After just a little research, I found a comparison of electric and gas-powered vehicles on the Earth.org website. In the article "The Environmental Impact of Battery Production for Electric Vehicles" they write: "...The bottom line is that while EVs have the benefits of no emissions and lowered noise levels during functioning, it is hard to consider them to be truly eco-friendly owing to the issues listed in this article" (such as toxic fumes released during the mining process for battery materials such as lithium and the water-intensive nature of the activity).

Through July and August, the Hourglass Bible Study is going three-dimensional!



Rental e-bikes are available nearby.


UPCOMING EVENTS
