For the vestry elections, parishioners will be asked to elect 3 candidates to fulfill 3 year terms.


Candidates' statements and videos will also be posted on St. Luke's website.

Theresa Goldsborough (current incumbent)

Hi, my name is Theresa Goldsborough. I have been a parishioner at St. Luke's for over 34 years. I am currently a warden, and sit on the Rector Advisory Committee, and I am an usher.
