SECOND SCRIPTURE READING John 10:22-30

At that time, the festival of the Dedication took place in Jerusalem. It was winter, and Jesus was walking in the temple, in the portico of Solomon. So the Jews gathered around him and said to him, "How long will you keep us in suspense? If you are the Messiah, tell us plainly." Jesus answered, "I have told you, and you do not believe. The works that I do in my Father's name testify to me, but you do not believe, because you do not belong to my sheep. My sheep hear my voice. I know them, and they follow me. I give them eternal life, and they will never perish. No one will snatch them out of my hand. What my Father has given me is greater than all else, and no one can snatch it out of the Father's hand. The Father and I are one."

A NOTE ON: The Updated Language in Our Doxology

God has many attributes. Hymn #760, Bring Many Names, describes God as "strong mother," "warm father," "old, aching," and "young, growing," reminding us that God is boundless and immeasurable. Yet Christians often focus on one image: God as father, God as man, using "he/him" language.

If asked whether God is a man, most answer "no." Yet, the language we use—what we sing and what we pray—shapes how we imagine God, our faith, and our world. Too often, our language focuses narrowly on God's masculine nature, reinforcing a vision of God that we know is too small.

Since Anglican Bishop Thomas Ken published his original Doxology text in 1709, countless adaptations have emerged—some to address the gendered language, others for seasonal use (like the version we sang during Lent), and others still simply to refresh this 300-year-old piece of our worship. Our updated lyrics retain the familiar rhyme and structure, making only small but meaningful edits to remind us that God's likeness is beyond our full knowing.
