Throughout Black History Month, we share reflections on the composers of our choir anthems to honor the rich legacy of Black sacred music, highlighting the contributions of Black composers whose faith and artistry have shaped both the church and the wider musical world.

Samuel Coleridge-Taylor (1875-1912) was a British composer of African descent whose choral and orchestral works brought spirituals and traditional African thematic content into classical concert halls. He achieved international fame at a young age, and his compositions were widely performed during his lifetime. His music affirmed the dignity and depth of Black musical traditions while bridging them with European classical forms.

“**O Ye That Love the Lord**” reflects his gift for writing non-idiomatic Black music. Non-idiomatic, as it relates to Black composers, refers to the original concert music that is not part of the traditional idiomatic canon associated with Black musicians, such as spirituals, gospel music, jazz, rap, etc.

SECOND SCRIPTURE READING

Now large crowds were traveling with him, and he turned and said to them, "Whoever comes to me and does not hate father and mother, wife and children, brothers and sisters, yes, and even life itself, cannot be my disciple. Whoever does not carry the cross and follow me cannot be my disciple. For which of you, intending to build a tower, does not first sit down and estimate the cost, to see whether he has enough to complete it? Otherwise, when he has laid a foundation and is not able to finish, all who see it will begin to ridicule him, saying, 'This fellow began to build and was not able to finish.' Or what king, going out to wage war against another king, will not sit down first and consider whether he is able with ten thousand to oppose the one who comes against him with twenty thousand? If he cannot, then while the other is still far away, he sends a delegation and asks for the terms of peace. So therefore, none of you can become my disciple if you do not give up all your possessions.

IMPORTANT MESSAGE FROM OUR TREASURER




