Throughout Black History Month, we share reflections on the composers of our choir anthems to honor the rich legacy of Black sacred music, highlighting the contributions of Black composers whose faith and artistry have shaped both the church and the wider musical world.

Stephen F. Key is an African American composer and church musician working in the DC Metro Area. His hymn “**Till We Gather Again**,” included in the African American Heritage Hymnal alongside many of Key's compositions, is today's Choral Benediction. It speaks to hope, perseverance, and the promise of reunion in God's presence. This piece is an example of the gospel style.
