

## FIRST SCRIPTURE READING Genesis 28:10-17

Jacob left Beer-sheba and went towards Haran. He came to a certain place and stayed there for the night, because the sun had set. Taking one of the stones of the place, he put it under his head and lay down in that place. 



## **Chrismons ARTINSTALLATION**



Chrismons are religious symbols representing many aspects of the Christian faith. The monograms were found in many places - jewelry, utensils, and even buildings. Early Christians used them to identify themselves to one another, to designate places of meeting of the church, and sometimes to show unbelievers where they stood. Chrismons can be made from nearly anything, cut into shapes, and decorated with paint, thread, or gold glitter.
