Dear Beloved Community,

As we enter the sacred season of Advent, our hearts turn again toward the promise at the center of our faith: **Emmanuel—God with us**. This is more than a phrase we sing or a story we remember. It is the profound truth that God steps into the world—not from a distance, not in theory, but in the flesh, in the mess, in the beauty, and in the longing of human life.

This year's Advent series invites us to pay attention to all the ways God is still with us—in our waiting, in our wondering, in our celebrations, and even in our challenges.

As Matthew reminds us, "Look, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and they shall name him Emmanuel," which means, "God with us" (Matthew 1:23). My hope is that throughout this season, each of us will find moments to breathe deeply, to be present, and to notice signs of Emmanuel in our homes, our relationships, and in the life of our church.

Your faithful giving throughout 2025 has made it possible for our congregation to worship boldly, serve generously, grow spiritually, and continue building the Beloved Community God calls us to be. Your commitment has strengthened our ministry, supported our staff, sustained mission partners, and allowed us to welcome people with warmth and hope.

Thank you for the ways you give—your prayers, your presence, your gifts, your service, and your witness. Each act of generosity reflects the very heart of Emmanuel, God with us.

4:00PM - 6:00PM




DEC 7
