2025 ANNUAL CONFERENCE UPDATE

Last month, Pastor Gary, Jeff McClellan, and Kathy Schluter attended the Wisconsin Annual Conference, a gathering of clergy and lay leaders from across the state. Centered on the theme "Grace is Sufficient," the event emphasized the need for churches to adapt and reach those on the margins, in line with the UMC's new vision:

Love Boldly. Serve Joyfully. Lead Courageously.

Key decisions included approving constitutional amendments from the 2024 General Conference to:

- 1. Create Regional Conferences with contextual flexibility,
- 2. Expand nondiscrimination policies to include gender and ability, and
- 3. Deepen commitments to racial justice.

A highlight was Bishop Jung's State of the Church address, encouraging innovation and collaboration during this pivotal moment in the church's life. His full message is available on YouTube.

ALLEVIATING SUFFERING ALL OVER THE WORLD: MYANMAR

Please continue to hold in prayer the people of Myanmar after a 7.7 magnitude earthquake struck the country in April. At least 1,644 people died and millions have been impacted by infrastructure damage and loss of power. The earthquake also led to the deadly collapse of a building in Bangkok, Thailand. Furthermore,

May's cyclone has been called one of the strongest storms to ever hit Myanmar, with hundreds more feared dead. Rohingha refugees along the border in Bangladesh also experienced losses. UMCOR recently awarded a solidarity grant to the Bangladesh Methodist Church for emergency relief, and we're focusing on Myanmar as our Mission of the Month throughout the summer months. - Candle of Peace: Mel Vance presented a proposed liturgy inspired by South African Methodist churches, featuring the weekly lighting of a "Candle of Peace" at the end of worship to symbolize hope and reconciliation.
- Pastoral Retreat Insights: Pastor Gary reported on a recent staff retreat focused on the "Simple Church" model (Connect, Grow, Serve). Plans include syncing the church calendar to this model, launching a Shelby app directory, and strengthening discipleship efforts.

- Recognition: Chelsea Montague and Craig Walker were thanked for their faithful service as they conclude their leadership terms.

- The next Council on Ministries meeting is scheduled for Sunday, October 12.
