#### A Letter From Pastor Gary Holmes

Dear Beloved Community,

We are living in a time when our nation—and even the Church—is deeply divided. Moral and social issues dominate our headlines, our conversations, and, too often, our relationships. Many of us would prefer to keep "politics" out of the church, but the reality is that our faith does not allow us to ignore the suffering of God's children or the way our nation treats people, both here at home and around the world.

At the heart of our faith is the conviction that every human being is a beloved child of God. To live faithfully into this belief, we must learn how to engage in meaningful dialogue with one another-even when we disagree. Building Beloved Community is not about avoiding difficult conversations; it is about entering them with openness, humility, and love, trusting that the Holy Spirit is at work among us. As members of Christ's body, we are called to fulfill our vows by accepting the freedom and power God gives us to resist evil, injustice, and oppression in whatever forms they present themselves.

Listening—truly listening—is a spiritual practice. It means slowing down our responses so that we can hear not only another person's words but also their heart. It means making space for the

Spirit to speak through voices we may not expect. It means honoring God by the way we listen and learn from one another, especially when we see things differently.

Beloved Community is not about ease or uniformity. It is about discovering unity in **Christ** that is deeper than our divisions, and welcoming diversity as a gift rather than a threat. This is hard, holy work—but it is also the path Jesus calls us to walk together.

As we enter this next season of ministry, my prayer is that we would courageously choose listening over labeling, dialogue over distance, love over fear, and peace with justice for all over comfort. May we trust the Spirit to lead us deeper into the way of Jesus as we seek to become the Beloved Community God has called us to be.


## Opportunity to Become a Lay Servant

Leaving the staff of this church after nearly 27 years is like a little death for me. Through the ups and downs and all arounds I have made this place my second home. I have watched people come and go, laughed and cried on a daily basis, and tried to be a faithful servant.

But as Christians we believe in life after death - in fact a more glorious life, where there is no more pain, no more suffering. While I don't know yet what God might be calling me to do in this next chapter of my life I feel certain that I will be led in the path in which I should go.

It has been my honor and privilege to work alongside you. I am grateful for the relationships - whether they were years in the making or simply a blink in time. I will always remember Pastor Dick Jones handing me a written job description for a Volunteer Coordinator position back in 1998 and saying "just think about it." (You can blame him.)

Finally, on a lighter note, some of you oldies like me may remember the hit movie Dirty Dancing from 1987 and the song that topped the charts for weeks and won the Academy award for best original song. I leave you with these words.. I've had...the time of my life....and I owe it all to You.
