



FOUNDATION, INNOVATION, AND PARTNERSHIPS

A message from Reverend Dr. Troy Underwood,
Executive Director, BWS Family Life Center

Thomas Edison once said, *“Genius is one percent inspiration and ninety-nine percent perspiration.”*

I don’t believe starting a not-for-profit organization was an act of genius, but rather a call from God for Covenant to reach into the community and do what Jesus said the community did for Him in Matthew 25:35–36: “For I was hungry and you gave me something to eat, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you invited me in; I needed clothes and you clothed me, I was sick and you looked after me, I was in prison and you came to visit me.”



What I do know to be true is that it has taken ninety-nine percent perspiration to build the Barbara W. Smith Life Center into what it is today. And it has been a privilege to serve as its Executive Director for the past six years.

As the BWS Family Life Center enters its **seventh year**, three words come to mind: Foundation, Innovation, and Partnerships. BWS Family Life Center has built a foundation of compassion and care through its mission of providing individuals and families with programs and resources for human flourishing and well-being.

We offer an ecosystem of services committed to empowering individuals and uplifting the community—whether through our food pantry, helping families regain second chances through our justice initiatives, becoming environmental stewards, or providing support for housing and health-care needs. We have built this strong foundation through a pandemic and during challenging economic times.

Despite these challenges, we chose to be innovative—knowing that innovation begins with curiosity. BWS Family Life Center used the tools available to deliver creative, forward-thinking services to the community. We focused on expanding educational opportunities for non-white, low-income children in our neighborhoods. S.T.E.A.M.—science, technology, engineering, arts, and math—became a pathway to expose youth in the south suburbs of Cook County, Illinois, to future careers.





To date, we have offered S.T.E.A.M. programs in A.I., coding, drones, gardening, and robotic engineering. Through our free S.T.E.A.M. summer camps for youth in grades 3–8, we have served nearly **200 young people** and employed college students as camp counselors. We are now preparing to equip high school content creators with tangible skills through our upcoming videography program.



Ralph Waldo Emerson said, “*Innovation begins with curiosity—and once the mind is opened to new ideas, it keeps growing.*” BWS Family Life Center will remain curious because curiosity has become a necessity in a community that seeks to keep growing. Yet we can only do this through partnerships.

From 2020 to 2025, funding and partnerships made all of this possible. Covenant Cares—and you—have been vital supporters.

FROM OUR YOUNG ADULTS

Being surrounded by other young adults, whether they are going through similar or different seasons of life, and coming together to pray, support, and encourage one another has been truly meaningful. I'm confident they will find a loving and supportive community.



PASTORAL CARE & WELLNESS

The PCW department is an **integral** part of CUCC, and it is fluid. PCW is responsible for the care of CUCC members; during illnesses, hospitalization, the death of a loved one, benevolence, and connecting members to outside resources in their time of need, among other responsibilities. All we do is made possible by working collegially with other ministers and community resources, including our partner health institutions, and outside colleagues. Additionally, there are five ministries under PCW; each works together to support one another toward the common goal of connecting with CUCC members and the community at large.

Deacons comprise thirty-five men and women who accepted their call to serve the members of CUCC. They are divided into four teams; one team is responsible for calling our sick & shut-in members as part of the weekly check-in. They not only check in with the members, but also offer prayer, scripture reading, song, and communion on The First Sunday of the month. One of the many duties of the deacons is attending the funerals at CUCC and off-site at other churches to support our members who experience death in their immediate families. Deacons are on their deacon duties all the time!

Needles & Knots Hands of Love is a very viable ministry where members use their hands to create creative hand-knit and crocheted items. Items such as lap bands, shawls, scarves, blankets, hats, gloves, etc. Their creative items are then donated to children of the Illinois Department of Family Services, Schools, Hospitals, nursing homes, and, for the second year, they've donated to the City of Hope in Hawaii with the assistance of Rev. Gwendolyn Kirkland.

CARE ministry has taken on the responsibility of sending the following cards: inspiration, comfort, Get Well, grief, and thinking of you to all members of CUCC. In addition, they partner with organizations that assist women and men residing in shelters with day-to-day personal needs. One such project is providing women's shelters with gently used women's purses, filled with personal items for everyday living. Also, CARE works with the New Members Ministry, sends Welcome to CUCC cards, and participates in CUCC's annual back-to-school event by donating school supplies.

You are not alone. Our grief ministry activities have resumed. Join us for 8 weeks as we journey with you to remember and honor your mother, father, sibling, child, or loved one. Through guided conversations, prayer, and community, we offer support for those seeking healing in a safe, sacred, and caring environment.

Health & Fitness ministry ministers to CUCC members and the community by offering a myriad of activities that address the Mind, Body & Soul. H&F intentionally addresses health issues disproportionately affecting our members and the community. We have developed strong relationships with significant health institutions within and outside our community. Programs such as United in Health, Cancer for All, an Alzheimer's informational session, and Menopause & Mental Health for Women, where Rush University Hospital offered screening. We also provide weekly line dancing & chair exercises; last fall, we introduced MGM Movement Gardening & Music and Balancing for eight weeks. We had an average of 70+ seniors combined on Tuesday, Wednesday, & Thursday, from CUCC and the community. The seniors, who

planted herbs and vegetables, received planters for their indoor home gardening. Organic fresh vegetables and herbs were purchased from the Black Farmers of Hopkins Park & Momence, Illinois. Each week, we had different food demonstrations on how to properly prepare foods with EVO & Coconut oil, without meat! Many of the participants stated they couldn't remember the last time they had so many vegetables. They listened to jazz from yesteryears, had quiet moments where they colored and enjoyed each other's company. We also had a quartet of jazz musicians, who came on the last day of the program. They enjoyed themselves immensely as they sat, patted their feet, and moved their heads from side to side.

Balance Sheet


Total cash increased over the prior year by \$50K, driven by a consistent monthly increase in giving units, which contributed to higher YTD giving of \$3.8M compared with \$3.6M in 2024.

The endowment fund realized a slight gain of \$443 for the month and \$18K for the year.


Pension asset and liability declined \$5K due to monthly payments to the former senior pastor.
