eflections from the lead pastor

I love attending anniversary and birthday celebrations, especially for those who have lots of years to count. If they are milestone years, someone in the family usually takes it upon themselves to gather photographs or keepsakes to commemorate the many years of life and the special memories shared with others.

On Nov. 12, Marvin will celebrate 175 years of ministry to Smith County and our community with special worship services, tours of the archives of the church, and a special all-church luncheon celebration and program. We will also have free horse and carriage rides around the church campus. Global Methodist Church Bishop Scott Jones will preach in sanctuary services while Rev. Jeff Olive, one of the first preachers in the now Core service, will preach in the Herd Worship Center. Former pastors will send greetings while others will return in person for the celebration.

Why celebrate?

Monumental celebrations like this are important to commemorate because forgetfulness is a spiritual pandemic ravaging humanity. Others may call it "spiritual myopia" or spiritual nearsightedness, but the danger is just the same. We get so preoccupied with the challenges of our current lives that we forget the long faithfulness of the God who inspires us.

God calls His people to "remember" many times throughout the Bible. As God's people commemorate the exodus from Egypt and the receiving of the Law from God, they are reminded in Deuteronomy 4:9, "Be careful and watch yourselves closely so that you do not forget the things your eyes have seen or let them fade from your heart as long as you live." The prophet Isaiah admonishes God's people in Isaiah 17:10, "You have forgotten God your savior; you have not remembered the Rock, your fortress." The Apostle John is strongly encouraged in the Book of Revelation (3:3) to "Remember, therefore, what you have received and heard; hold it fast."

What's an Ebenezer?

Not only were God's people asked to remember, but they were also given instructions about how to set up memorial markers so the stories of God's faithfulness could be retold with visual promptings. In Joshua 4, God instructs Joshua to gather stones from the Jordan river crossing and create a memorial so that people would be prompted to retell the story. Similarly, in the book of 1 Samuel, the prophet was asked to pick up a stone and set it up so that people, when seeing the stone, would remember that God delivered them from their enemies. The stone was called "Ebenezer," the meaning being "Thus far the Lord has helped us" (1

Samuel 7:12).

If you have ever sung the old hymn Come Thou Fount of Every Blessing, you have sung the words, "Here I raise my Ebenezer; hither by thy



help I've come." If you have ever found yourself asking, "What's an Ebenezer?" and "Why am I raising one?" well, now you know. The Israelites were asked to remember the faithfulness of God by looking back at a rock that had a story to tell.

Our story

Marvin Church has a great story to tell. With the help of Marilyn Hardy, you have been reading some wonderful stories about Marvin's history (its missions program, Sunday School classes and music programs) in our MarvinLife newsletters. The archives display on the second-floor breezeway has also been offering pictures and other historical artifacts throughout this year.

Did you know?

Did you know the Methodists were the first church to withdraw from the Union Church of Protestants to form their own congregation? Did you know that in 1886, the church board resolved to build our current sanctuary, and when it was completed in 1891 it was known as "the Cathedral of the South" and "the finest Methodist sanctuary in Texas?" Did you know that during an economic downturn, the church was sold to the highest bidder on the courthouse steps in 1897? Did you know that Mrs. M.B. Adams called the church to fast and pray to save the church?

Here are some other interesting facts to reflect upon: As early as 1906, church orchestras were helping to lead worship, and in 1910, Marvin had the largest Sunday School program in the church's conference. In 1941, Marvin went through a major sanctuary renovation, redesigning the chancel area and balconies and creating a center aisle with straightened pews. In 1984, the church campus doubled in size as Pirtle Hall, Herd Worship Center and Fair Gymnasium were built.

What is Stephen Ministry?

·FOR

Stephen Ministry is a one-to-one caring ministry that provides confidential Christ-centered care to people experiencing a difficult time in life.

"Christ himself gave the apostles, the prophets, the evangelists, the pastors and teachers, to equip 🍃 his people for works of service, so that the body of Christ may be built up" (Ephesians 4:11-12).

Stephen Ministers are lay Christians selected. trained and supervised to provide effective Christian care. After 50

very comprehensive hours of training, Stephen Ministers are assigned a care receiver with whom they meet once a week for about an hour. Stephen Ministers also meet regularly for supervision, support and continuing education.

Throughout congregations and communities there are many struggles that are experienced day in and day out. Potential care receivers are:

- Lonely.
- Grieving the loss of a loved one.
- Separated or in the process of a divorce.
- Terminally ill and their families.
- Experiencing loss of job or financial setbacks.

- Experiencing crisis situations.
- Experiencing hurt from abuse.
- Adjusting to life-changing situations:

stay-at-home parent, retirement, promotion, new parent, empty nester, graduating from college, etc.

Need someone to come alongside of nthem during an especially difficult time, a caring soul who can help them process their feelings, their fears, their anger, their lack of faith and yet provide hope.

Stephen Ministers are

not professional counselors, clinical therapists, experts in law, finance, or church doctrine. Stephen Ministers pray, listen, explore feelings, share Christ's love, maintain confidentiality, attend to the care-giving process and leave the results to God. Stephen Ministers are the care givers and God is the cure giver.


