

How to Celebrate Christmas with Peace & Joy!

Christmas is exciting for everyone, but no one loves Christmas more than kids! So how do we become intentional about helping our kids understand that it's about the birth of Jesus and not just the presents?

One tradition we had with our kids was that they got interviewed during the Thanksgiving weekend for us to find out their gift wishes. Because my kids got a LOT of gifts from grandparents, cousins, etc. we kept our family gifts to three each year. (The same number that the Magi gave to baby Jesus.) And we had some guidelines: they could choose a book, an item of clothing, and a toy or something they REALLY wanted.

It's great to add some Advent activities to your weeks before Christmas too. Use the Advent Family Activities booklet provided by WLCkids. Watch a Christmas movie like "The Star" which tells the story of the birth of Jesus and read the story of Jesus' birth from the Bible in Luke 2:1-20.

"Jesus, lead me to listen to your voice and follow you. Amen."

For two years we have been praying this prayer and God has been answering in incredible ways. Coming out of COVID we felt like God was leading us to step out with a bold vision for ministry in 2022-2023. Our goal was to raise \$9 million dollars to fund ministry where we were:

- Growing in our *Discipleship Impact* by connecting more people to Jesus.
- Expanding our *Missional Reach* through local and global efforts.
- Ready to add another *physical campus* as He leads.
- Completely free *from debt*.

We are so very close to reaching thos goals, but it will take all of us to get there. Here are just a few things that have happened because of our generosity:

- Our in-person worship is now averaging over 1350 people.
- Our most recent Pizza with the Pastor had 44 people attend.
- Each of our campuses has seen significant building upgrades.
- Our mission impact has grown locally and globally.
- We are putting money away for our next campus.
- Last year we fully paid off our debt.

To celebrate all that God is doing this Christmas we are committing ahead of time to take a portion of our Christmas offering (around 40k) to cover the cost for a Tiny Home to be built through our ministry partner Settled. As we start our journey to the Inn isn't it fitting that we provide a home for someone who is struggling with housing, but more than that through Settled we help to provide a community so that a person can see that they are loved and valued, that the child in the manger came for them.

A generous heart that reflects the generosity of our God brings His Kingdom into the world in incredible ways. Thank you for being so generous. Let's finish this ministry year strong so that our generosity would be a witness to the world.

Our Stephen Ministers are available to those who have experienced a loss of any kind, difficult life change or other misfortune that may bring us to low places.

2023 held great impact on our community, all thanks to your dedication to REACH out to others in thought, word, and deed. Let's celebrate what God did in and through us:

WLC impacted New Life Family Services through the diaper & bottle drives, Together for Good through backpacks for foster care, Feed My Starving Children through thousands of meals packed, and Valley Outreach through food gathered at our Summer Night In event.

Additionally, at each of our campuses we impacted our local neighbors. Here are some campus highlights:

Valley Creek has continued to invest in Highwood Hills School by providing helping hands and donations for many events throughout the year, such as their STEM education night. There is a group of volunteers delivering Every Meal food bags to students with food insecurity on a weekly basis. And volunteers who gather to help at Open Cupboard regularly.

Oak Hill has continued to collect food for Valley Outreach. The Booyah event raised money for Meals from the Heart. And there has been regular investment in Trinity First Lutheran School (including cross campus effort from volunteers at all 3 campuses) to support weekly lunch needs and maintenance needs.

Wakota Ridge has conducted several food drives for Neighbors Inc., provided helping hands at Kaposia Elementary School for events, and has a group of volunteers delivering Every Meal food bags to students with food insecurity on a weekly basis. Not included in these highlights is the continued



financial and prayer support poured out to all partnerships: Settled, Arrive, LINC, Every Meal, Feed My Starving Children, Mosaic, Oromo Evangelical, Open Cupboard, Valley Outreach, Neighbors Inc., Together for Good, and New Life Family Services. And let us not forget the importance of simply showing up and being present at events such as Summer Night In, National Night Out, Summer Blast, and more, where people were REACHed and cared for.

To each of you who participated and served this year, THANK YOU for reflecting the love of Christ. I'd like to invite you to consider how you might be a part of REACH this next year. When we don't get what we want, what is our response? Do we just take the situation into our own hands? Do we shut down or complain? Has a friend or family member ever compared you to a golden retriever? Probably not, but it has happened to me...and not just once. With that self-deprecating fun-fact out there, I want to share that the WLCYouth Wednesdays just wrapped up a series that I needed to hear as much as I needed to teach it. Our "**FOCUS**" series reminded and invited us to keep our eyes on Jesus, and to live the Disciple life, even in a world that is so busy, confusing, and distracting.

The reminder to refocus on Jesus is a helpful message any day of the year, but especially as we step into this Christmas season. We all know that "Jesus is the reason for the season", but we also know that it's not that easy to make him the FOCUS of the season. Our December calendars and to-do lists are jam packed with decorating. shopping. cooking. travel planning, family gatherings, traditions, concerts, parties, and a million other things that need to be done. Our pursuit of the "perfect Christmas" doesn't leave much wiggle room to pause and reflect on the fact that our God became flesh to live with us and to save us.

It makes me think of another Mary that doesn't make an appearance in your nativity set. In Luke 10:38-42, Jesus visits the house of Mary and Martha. If you're familiar with the story, you know that Martha is caught up in the task of hosting such an important guest, while her sister Mary chooses to sit at Jesus' feet. Jesus uses two words to describe the sisters' focuses in his time with them... "listening" and "distracted"

It certainly is easy to be the latter of those two, isn't it? Martha's approach makes sense, doesn't it? Stuff needs to get done! But as followers of Jesus, sitting and listening to him is far more valuable. There is nothing better for us than to use this season to discover our identity in Christ, to become more like him, and to help lead others (including the young people entrusted to us) to do the same!

So as impossible as it sounds, I want to encourage you to take a 30-minute pause sometime in the next 24 hours to refocus before launching towards the 25th. Put everything on hold and simply sit at the feet of Jesus. Use the prompts below if they're helpful.

• What does Jesus' coming to this

earth tell you about who God is and what he's like? What does it tell you about who you are?

- What potential distractions does this season hold? How can you right-size those? How can you invite Jesus into them?
- What opportunities does this season have for you to discover your identity in him, and to become more like him?
- How can you help others do the same? How can God use you to point your family and those closest to you to encounter Jesus right now?

I pray that you and your family would be focused on Jesus and will find delight in living the Disciple Life this Christmas season! Check <u>wlc.church</u> or the planning center app for ways you and yours can **FOCUS** on Jesus and let us know if there are other ways we can help!

Church Council Update November 2023

Woodbury Lutheran Church - Council Meeting Tuesday, November 14, 2023 6:30-8:30am

Meeting Highlights

Financial Report:

Mike presented the outline for our 2024 budget. We have made some significant changes to the format to better align with our EOS Accountability chart and to continue to make sure that expenses are aligned in the correct line item. We are looking to budget a 1-3% increase for the 2023 operating budget. As in years past, a large portion of the budget is allocated to staffing, buildings, and missions.

EOS Operating System:

With the Council's blessings we are knee deep in implementing the EOS organizational operating system. We are finalizing our accountability chart, staff values, focus/vision and short term/long term goals. We are very excited to share this change with the congregation in January at our Annual Meeting.

Council Advisory Teams:

The Financial Advisory Team met and will continue to serve as an advisory group for Mike, Tom, and the Council. The Governance Ministry Action Team is up and running with the primary focus of reviewing the Constitution and making recommended changes that the congregation will eventually have to vote on. 
