



The Star and the Crescent: A History of Jewish-Muslim Relations

The current friction often felt between Muslims and Jews was not always the norm. Following the emergence of Islam, it was far better to be Jewish in a Muslim country than in a Christian one, and often, people of both faiths found ways to coexist peacefully and productively. This course will delve into prior periods of enmity to gain a more nuanced perspective. We'll examine the commonalities between our cultures, as well as sources of tension between these two monotheistic communities, challenging our assumptions and broadening our understanding.


