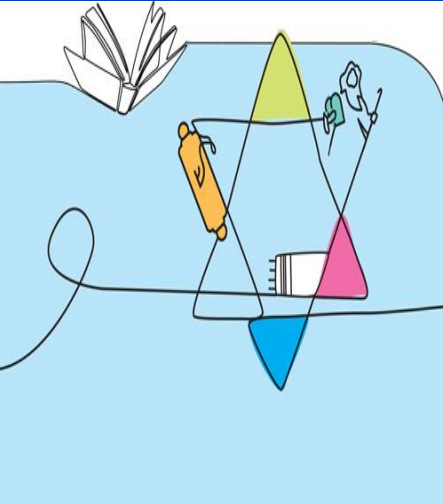

This course will bring together selections from the most important works by three Jewish philosophers of the Middle Ages. All students of Jewish thought should be familiar with these seminal writers: Philo, the leading writer of the Hellenistic Jewish community of Alexandria, Egypt; Saadya Gaon, known for his works on Hebrew linguistics, halakha, and Jewish philosophy; and Yehuda HaLevi, who is considered one of the greatest Hebrew poets, celebrated both for his secular and religious poems, many of which appear in our present-day liturgy. His most famous philosophical work is the Kuzari. **This course is designed by local faculty.**
