JOHN 1:40-46 – COME AND SEE

"We have found the Messiah... Come and see."

Q1: How does God use ordinary people here?

Q2: What's the power of "Come and see" today?

Q3: Who can you invite this Easter?

ISAIAH 6:8 – A HOLY COMMISSION

"Then I heard the voice of the Lord saying, 'Whom shall I send?'..."

Q1: Why is God's holiness essential before our mission?

Q2: How are you saying "Here I am" now?

Q3: Are you willing to be sent without knowing the full plan?

WHY THIS MATTERS TODAY

- In our post-Christian, post-truth world, the church must:
 - Recover a high view of the Gospel's power (Rom. 1:16)
 - Reclaim the Spirit's empowerment for witness (Acts 1:8)
 - Recognize the urgency of proclamation (Rom. 10:14–15)
 - Restore a culture of relational invitation (John 1)
 - Respond like Isaiah—with availability, humility, and urgency
