At 18 she changed her name to the more androgynous Mel and continued garnering attention as an accomplished composer. Hearing Bonis's first piano quartet caused Saint-Saëns to exclaim, "I never imagined a woman could write such music!" Let the beauty of these pieces and the context of inequality resonate deeply and remind you we worship a God who has gifted all people!
