THE GREEN

When all the earth is brown, when the leaves have left the trees, evergreens stand in lonely vigil until the earth is green again. Perhaps the most universal icon of Christmas is the use of evergreens in both homes and churches. They are ever-green, ever-alive, even in the midst of winter. Used by Christians for hundreds of years, they symbolize the unchanging nature of our God and they remind us of the everlasting life that is ours in Christ Jesus. Evergreens shout to us the hope for the coming green again, and serve as a reminder of love offered.





THE POINSETTIAS

Poinsettias are star-like and alive in splendid color, calling us to celebrate the miracle of the Christ-child. They grow to glorify and to commemorate the night that other stars shouted forth the glory of God. Because they are bright and lively in the cold, short days of winter, we use them to echo the Christmas miracle. Their shape suggests the star that shone over Bethlehem; their yellow flowers remind us of the One born the infant King; their blood-red leaves foreshadow the cruelty of the cross; their green leaves reflect the abundant life that is ours through the Gift of God.

THE CHRISMON TREE

As we adorn the trees in our homes with ornaments that tell the story of our family, so too we adorn the tree in our sanctuary with symbols that tell the story of Christ. While Chrismons are the newest of the traditions we use tonight, the symbols themselves are ancient. The word Chrismon is a compound of Christ and Monogram, but they are much more than mere symbols as they tell the story of Jesus. Each one, colored in white and gold, proclaims the truths of God as made know by Jesus and point beyond themselves to God.





THE LIGHTING OF THE TREE

We add our light with the light of the coming Christ-child, as the lights reminds us that we have become God's light in a dark world. The glow of each tiny light on the tree reminds us that each of us is to let our lives shine before all, as we reflect the glory of God. We know that those who have found salvation in Christ no longer walk in darkness. We are compelled by the very Christ whose birth we honor to light the way for others.

THE GIFTS

The Shepherds gave of themselves, the Magi gave out of their treasures, the Angels gave songs of God's glory, as God gave us Christ to save the World. In this time of preparation and celebration of the coming baby Jesus, we are presented with many examples to follow in giving. The gifts that we bring tonight are reminiscent of the gifts given to the infant Christ and of the gift God gave us in this babe. Because they symbolize the giving of our lives to God anew, the presents we bring are but a beginning of what God calls us to give.
