## 2024 Budget Proposal

The Ministry Council, Finance Ministry Group, and Personnel Ministry Group have been working on additional reductions to the proposed 2024 budget. Last week, the Ministry Council

unanimously voted to approve an updated budget with \$27,000 additional cuts from what was previously presented to the church in the QCC. **Our proposed budget for 2024 is \$1,343,858, compared to our 2023 budget of \$1,345,229.** 

The Finance Ministry Group and the Ministry Council recommend moving forward with presenting this budget to the church to discuss and vote on. We are also very mindful that if our income does not change over the next 12 months, more cuts will need to be made next year.

There will be a special called business meeting to discuss this budget and the additional changes in more detail on Wednesday, November 15 at 6:15 PM in the Fellowship Hall. We will also make this meeting available online for those needing to be home, and there will be a way for you to ask questions from home as well. The link to join us via Zoom is available <a href="here">here</a>.

Even as we feel the pain of these budget reductions, the Ministry Council believes that we continue to be in a healthy place as a congregation. These changes are a reality for many churches and organizations navigating their way forward in a post-COVID world. Just as you have to trim and scale back in gardening in order to allow for future growth, we sometimes have to do the same in everyday life. We believe Highland can do this, and we are continually grateful for the generosity, wisdom, and faithfulness of this congregation.






### 2 Sorting Soirees

## **Sacred Space Project Update**

All of those tubes and pipes from the wells in the parking lot have to eventually end up inside the building, where the new HVAC system will pull heat and cooling that was harvested from 400 feet underground. The pipes were pulled underneath the alley, then a hole was trenched next to the building so that the pipes could enter through the foundation (about 3 feet below ground level). For the moment the pipes terminate behind the soon-to-be-replaced air handler in the basement mechanical room.





Last week excavation on the new mechanical room beneath the choir loft began taking shape, as dirt is being removed by the 5-gallon bucket full and the wheelbarrow full. The black poles in the picture are temporary supports that will be removed once steel reinforcement is added to the ceiling of the space.

# Safe-surrender event turns unwanted guns into garden tools

"They shall beat their swords into plowshares, and their spears into pruning hooks..." Isaiah 2:4

Saturday Nov. 18, 2023 12-2 p.m.

### **Westwood Presbyterian Church**

Parking lot, 4432 Greenwood Ave., Louisville 40211

HOW: Anyone can bring unwanted guns. Those bringing guns are anonymous.

Each person surrendering one or more guns will receive a gift card, while supplies last.

- Guns must be unloaded prior to entering church property and placed in trunk or rear
  of vehicle. Skilled personnel will remove firearms from vehicles and take them to a
  chop saw for disabling while the person bringing the gun is present.
- · Serial numbers will be recorded to document the gun's destruction.
- Ammunition will not be accepted.
- The gun pieces will be forged into tools, art, or jewelry at a later date.

#### WHY: Many guns in our community are no longer wanted for a variety of reasons:

- There is concern that the gun might fall unintentionally into the hands of children or grandchildren in the home.
- The gun may have been used in a suicide or accident.
- Someone can no longer handle guns safely because of age or disability.
- A person inherited a gun but does not want it or know how to use it.

#### WHO: This event is organized by a coalition of individuals

from faith and community groups concerned about gun violence in Louisville. It is part of a national Guns to Gardens movement launched in cooperation with <u>RAWtools</u> and <u>Presbyterian Peace Fellowship</u>.


