# Calling for a Ceasefire in Gaza

The Alliance of Baptists, of which Highland Baptist Church is a member, serves as a theological home for congregations committed to pursuing God's call to justice and love.

On behalf of the alliance, co-director Reverend Elijah R. Zehyoue, Ph.D., has <u>called for a ceasefire</u> <u>in Gaza</u> and has invited Alliance members "to find your moral clarity in this moment, learn more about the way of nonviolence, and join us in being a witness to the power of nonviolence as an avenue for seeking God's Beloved Community."




