


Pastoral Update Regarding Don Burke

They are making plans for a memorial service at Don's former church in Canada, where his family still resides. Sacred Space Project Update

The Christmas and New Year holidays didn't slow down work on our Sacred Space project. First, the main parking lot is available to use again. It's been patched and the parking bumpers are back in place. The final re-surfacing of the lot won't occur until this Spring, but feel free to park in the lot



The new mechanical room UNDER the sanctuary is approaching its final size. This is the space where the new equipment that will power heating and cooling for the sanctuary and the choir loft will live. Note that all of the dirt from the room has been removed BY HAND, in five-gallon buckets and in wheelbarrows. The crew responsible for digging this out has done amazing work.







Later this month you'll experience some big changes in the sanctuary as work begins to repaint and relight that space. Stay tuned!


