Epiphany feels like it gets the short end of the stick in the liturgical calendar. We're all worn out by Advent and Christmas activities and celebrations, and we just want to catch our breath a bit before Lent and Easter, so we tend to "skip over" the season of Epiphany. But Epiphany has such rich wisdom to offer, especially as we begin a new year together, if we would take the time to follow the signs that it offers.

The word "Epiphany" comes from the Greek, "epiphaneia," meaning "appearing" or "revealing." Each Sunday of Epiphany, I believe we are offered an opportunity to see or encounter the Holy One with us in a new way.

In her blog, *Journey with Jesus*, Debie Thomas writes, "During this brief liturgical season between Christmas and Lent, we're invited to leave miraculous births and angel choirs behind, and seek the love, majesty, and power of God in seemingly mundane things. Rivers. Voices. Doves. Clouds. Holy hands covering ours, lowering us into the water of repentance and new life. In the

gospel stories we read during this season, God parts the curtain for brief, shimmering moments, allowing us to look beneath the ordinary surfaces of our lives, and catch glimpses of the extraordinary."



Virtual Book Launch: Hard and Holy Work

Tyler Mayfield and I couldn't be more excited to finally share our book and labor of love with the world! Tomorrow, on **Wednesday**, **January 10**, Sally Evans will be interviewing Tyler and me on Highland's Facebook and YouTube accounts for a livestreamed, virtual event at 11:00 AM to help officially launch our book into the world. We would love for you to join us!



This book was birthed out of some of my earliest sermons at Highland at the height of the pandemic, and in the midst of the protests for justice for Breonna Taylor here in our hometown of Louisville, Kentucky. Whenever we find ourselves in the wilderness, like we did in 2020, we long for the spiritual sustenance to carry us through, especially when the journey ahead feels so overwhelming. *Hard & Holy Work* provides a space for just that, helping readers to become more attuned to God's boundless presence with us, even and especially in the wilderness.

However, an awareness of the holy ground beneath us is just the beginning. Like Moses, we can't walk away from a burning bush and not be changed! Instead, we leave the burning bushes of our lives with an invitation from God - a call to join in what we call "hard and holy work," creating a world where justice and love are abundant.


Throughout the book, we explore this invitation alongside stories from the book of Exodus that have inspired the work of liberation for centuries, coupled with Tyler's thought-provoking insights as a Hebrew scholar all along the way.

Of course, Tyler and I do not pretend to have all the answers, and this study is not our attempt to fix all the complicated systems of injustice in our world. Instead, it is our humble effort to take a faithful next brave step in the right direction. So, we invite you to join us! We are traveling toward greater awareness in God's world, with all its beauty and challenges, as the Spirit calls us toward the work of justice and love.


