An Invitation to Conversation

Dear Highland Family,

Over the past several months, we (Mary Alice and Lauren) have heard from an increasing number of you within the church wanting space for us as a congregation to discuss what is happening in Gaza and how we might faithfully respond. On Sunday, February 18, we will host a congregational time to lament, listen, and learn alongside one another from 4:00-5:30 PM in the Sanctuary.



We recognize that no single meeting or conversation will do this deeply complex and troubling situation justice. However, we would like to approach this time together in the ways that Highland does best: through the lenses of thinking, feeling, and healing.

Thinking: We've asked professors Roy Fuller and Tyler Mayfield to help with some education in language and history with an interfaith lens as we consider how we can best love our Jewish and

Muslim neighbors. We also want to spend some time learning about the effects of generational trauma and how it relates to this centuries deep conflict.

Feeling: As of today, 27,000 people have died in this war and even more have been displaced. We will begin with a time of lament and prayer for this horrific pain in God's world.

Healing: Our hope is that this time of lament and learning will beckon us toward asking how we can help bring about healing and peace in God's world.


We hope you will join us in-person for this initial congregational step toward equipping ourselves to do justice and love mercy as we seek to walk humbly with God in the midst of our hurting world.

Wednesday Black History Month Classes

Join Highland members on Wednesdays, February 21 and 28 at 6:15 p.m. in watching an inspirational speech given by Bryan Stevenson at a United Church of Christ General Synod assembly luncheon last year. Drawing on his faith and experience, including his work as an attorney defending vulnerable clients, many individuals on death row, Stevenson talks about how to engage the work of justice with courage, compassion, and a fierce hope for a better world.





Stevenson is the founder and Executive Director of the Equal Justice Initiative, a human rights organization in Montgomery, Alabama, that has won major legal challenges by exonerating innocent death row prisoners, confronting abuse of persons in prison, including those with mental illness, and aiding children prosecuted as adults. He also led the effort to create the Legacy Museum and the National Memorial for Peace and Justice in Montgomery, which several of our church members visited on a 2022 trip to visit racial justice sites in Alabama.

We will watch the speech over two Wednesday nights, with time for discussion. Please be warned that some of his stories mention physical abuse, including physical and sexual abuse of a jailed child.

Because his audience is made up of Christian leaders, Stevenson does not shy away from how his faith has been the guiding point of his life's work, and he gives a rousing call to action to people of faith.


Highland Welcomes Clif Cason



Clif Cason, our organist for the month of February, has been a church musician for over forty-five years serving churches from a variety of denominations: Episcopal, Disciples of Christ, Congregational and Presbyterian (USA). He was an adjunct lecturer and teacher at Lexington Theological Seminary. Clif studied with Madame Marie-Claire Alain and was awarded the Premier Prix from the Conservatoire de Rueil-Malaison, just outside of Paris, France. His degrees are from the University of Kentucky (BM), University of Illinois (MM) and Indiana University (MLS). Clif and his wife, Shari, reside in Lexington, KY, and have three children.

Sacred Space Project Update

The big news for this week is that the new sanctuary chandeliers are being hung. The picture below shows the first of the old chandeliers being prepared to come down. Note that while the new chandeliers will be in place in time for Friday Church and Sunday Worship, the new lighting control system won't be installed yet.
