Easter Sunday at Highland





Holy Week is upon us! As we prepare for special services and festivities at the end of the week, we are also preparing to receive a large number of guests with us on Easter Sunday. Here are some ways you can help in continuing to make Highland a welcoming space for everyone who joins us:

- If you have flexibility in your Sunday morning schedule, consider attending the 8:45 AM
 worship service so that we can make space in the sanctuary for more guests attending the
 11:15 service. The full choir, handbells, and brass ensemble will be sharing music in both
 services.
- 2. **Sign-up to bring a breakfast item** for Easter breakfast! Think easy, individual-portions for a large group of people. Please bring a disposable pan/tray/box, or remember to pick up your container before you leave. Please sign up here or call Marilyn Whisler at 502-262-2760.
- 3. If you are physically able, **consider parking a bit further away** than you might normally to allow ample spaces in the parking lot for guests and others who need closer access to the building.
- 4. **Bring fresh flowers to adorn our Easter cross** outside on the lawn! This is a great, intergenerational activity for everyone to share on Easter morning, and a beautiful symbol for our

community driving by that Love always wins!

5. **Finally, greet someone you don't know!** Whether they've been coming to Highland for ten years or they are a first-time guest for Easter, Sunday's gathering on the lawn is a purposeful opportunity for us to get to know one another, to re-connect with those we haven't seen in awhile, and to celebrate the joy of the resurrection as a community of faith.

We are looking forward to a beautiful Holy Week at Highland! Thank you to ALL the volunteers, musicians, childcare workers, choir members, greeters, deacons, hospitality group members, worship ministry group members, and more who generously give of themselves to help make this week meaningful, worshipful, and a genuine space of welcome for our entire community.

Sanctuary Choir Anthem: Lift Up Your Heads—G. F. Handel




Cloud of Witness: March 27, 6:15 p.m., Fellowship Hall

This intimate service takes place in smaller gatherings around the Fellowship Hall. This year, we will start early to offer a time of fellowship with charcuterie snacks. Afterward we will join in a time of communion, hymns, reading Scripture, and hand washing.




