I hope you'll save some of these upcoming dates and take advantage of these opportunities to relax, re-connect, and have fun with our fabulous community of faith.



Sacred Space Financial Update

As you can see (and feel) on a regular basis around Highland these days, our renovation work continues on numerous fronts to all of our church buildings. With the excitement and anticipation for the completion of this project also comes the upcoming deadline when we will owe final payment to the various companies completing this work. We are in the final phases of securing a large loan to make sure we can pay our bills!



As you can see from the updated chart, almost \$1 million has been contributed with a little over \$900,000 in pledges outstanding and almost the same amount still needed in additional gifts. Over the next several months, we will be borrowing well over \$2 million, as we expect all \$3.8 million worth of work to be completed by July or August. We are very grateful to Susan Pierce and Tracy Holliday for the *hours* of work, wisdom, and perseverance they have put into helping us in the loan application process.

We are also grateful to all of you who have contributed so far and to those of you who are continuing to make your pledge payments! Please remember:

- If you have not made a pledge, we would be very delighted to receive it! All gifts (pledged and un-pledged) are greatly needed, and gratefully received!

Sacred Space Project Update

The old boilers, air handlers, pumps, and related hardware from our OLD heating system are gone! Their absence explains the comment at the top of the newsletter, concerning how you dress at church in the coming weeks, but it also marks the next step in preparing the space for our new HVAC systems. Below are the "old" pump and mechanical rooms.





Beneath the sanctuary, trench work is well underway to make space around the sanctuary's perimeter for new ductwork. As of this writing the trench has reached from the organ console to the back corner of the sanctuary (organ side). Because all that dirt must be dug by hand, a conveyer system was added to move the dirt from the far reaches beneath the sanctuary back to the new mechanical room, where it can be wheelbarrowed out of the building. Also underway are conversations to determine specifications for the layout of ductwork under the choir loft and chancel in the sanctuary. (Architect Bruce Rogers, general contractor David Bryant, and one of our subcontractors are pictured on the right below)


