



Welcoming Rev. Dr. Lynn Brinkley for CBF Global Missions Month



As part of our month-long emphasis on CBF Global Missions, this week we will welcome Rev. Dr. Lynn Brinkley to preach at Highland. Lynn grew up in Fayetteville, NC. She earned her Bachelor of Arts degree from North Carolina State University, a Master of Science in Criminal Justice from the University of Tennessee at Chattanooga, a Master of Divinity degree from Campbell University Divinity School, and a Doctor of Ministry degree from Gordon-Conwell Theological Seminary in South Hamilton, MA and just recently, she earned a second Doctor of Ministry degree from Howard University School of Divinity in Washington, DC.

Lynn recently accepted a new call to serve with the Cooperative Baptist Fellowship as the Pan African Koinonia Ministry Coordinator. She has also served as the Associate Director of Baptist Women in Ministry (2020-2024). Prior to that, she served for 13 years as Director of Church, Alumni, and Student Relations at Campbell University Divinity School where she remains as an adjunct instructor.

Lynn is an ordained Baptist minister at First Baptist Church in Fayetteville. She serves as the immediate past chair of the executive committee for Baptist Joint Committee for Religious Liberty based in Washington, DC and the Commission on Race and Gender for the Baptist World Alliance. She is regularly called upon to preach and teach in churches of diverse denominations across the United States, and we are thrilled to welcome her to Highland this week!

Sacred Space Project Update

For weeks you've seen pictures of demolition occurring inside the building in preparation for the installation of new HVAC hardware. We've reached the point where we're beginning to see the addition of some of the mechanical gear that's a part of the new geothermal system. First, a look at the room that is being constructed underneath the sanctuary chancel and the first few rows of pews. Once this cinderblock room is completed, the contractors will begin bringing in the hardware that will service the sanctuary. That's right, this room is beneath the sanctuary.



In the rooms that used to house the boilers and pumps of the old HVAC system, mechanical systems and pipes are being installed. It's a wonderful and amazing thing to see these old spaces (located behind the women's restroom near the Fireside Room) come to life again. Both of these images are in the old boiler room.

Presentation and Conversation Regarding Israel and Palestine

The Anti-Racism Team invites you to attend this class on Wednesday, May 15 at 6:15 PM in the Fellowship Hall, which will continue our discussion of the war and conflict in Palestine and Israel.



This Wednesday, Amy Shir, a local social and economic justice activist who helped organize Jewish Louisvillians for Peace following the Hamas attack on Israelis October 7th, 2023 will lead our time together. She has been to Israel four times. She studied in Jerusalem her junior year of college, toured extensively in the West Bank/Palestine, worked in a battered women's shelter in Haifa and lived on a beautiful Kibbutz on the Mediterranean Sea.

Amy will discuss being Jewish and (historically) a Zionist while being completely critical of Israeli Prime Minister Netanyahu, his war cabinet and Hamas. Amy will make a distinction between being against this horrific war in Gaza, being against the oppression of Palestinians, being against Jewish settlements in Palestine, and being antisemitic. Amy will speak for herself only, as she does not represent any organization or cause – except for peace and liberation of Palestinians and Israelis.
