Festival of Homiletics

You may not know that I have a close circle of pastor friends with whom I have shared life and ministry over the past four years. Since COVID, we have met with one another almost monthly over Zoom calls to share about various challenges, ideas, and questions we have in our ministries, and to offer encouragement and support for one another in the "hard and holy work" that we share. Back in 2022, we began trying to meet in-person once a year, and last week, we met in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania at the Festival of Homiletics.



We soaked in rich sermons and lectures by some of our favorite preachers, pastors, theologians, and writers. We attended book releases for <u>Brian McLaren</u> and <u>Grace Ji-Sun Kim</u>, heard incredible sermons by <u>Amy Butler</u> and <u>Otis Moss III</u> and learned to read stories of the Old Testament with a completely new lens from <u>Anna Carter Florence</u>. However, the conversations we shared over meals and late into the night were even richer. From topics like church budgets and staffing and aging buildings to the future of the Church and new sermon ideas to how we plan to care for ourselves and our congregations in the midst of an election year, we covered the gamut. It is gift and grace to share this "odd and wondrous calling" with my friends Carol McEntyre (First Baptist Greenville, SC), Preston Clegg (Second Baptist Little Rock, AR), and Jason Edwards (Second Baptist Liberty, MO); I am a better person and pastor because of each of them.

Thank you to our staff for covering for me during this time away last week, and thank you, Highland, for making renewing experiences like this possible for your pastors! I'm sure you will hear many of the stories, reflections, and ideas I gleaned from the conference in my sermons in the days and weeks to come.

Sacred Space Project Update

We are hard at work installing a temporary cooling solution in the sanctuary, until we are able to turn on the new HVAC system. While these four units (pictured below) won't provide all of the cooling of our new system, they should take the edge off the heat of the season. You'll see them in the four corners of the sanctuary this weekend.



Work continues in other parts of the building. The room that abuts the Commons and that used to house the first floor air handler will eventually become the new music storage room, but not until electrical panels are moved, new system piping is installed, and ductwork is routed. 








Louisville Homicides
