

Main dietary items are needed, but also things to round out a meal like milk (shelf-stable), condiments, chips, and crackers.















Juneteenth 2024

The Emancipation Proclamation was signed on January 1, 1863. This proclamation did not mean freedom for all who were held in captivity and bondage; enslavers kept the news of the change in laws from those they enslaved for many years after. On June 19, 1865, Major General <u>Gordon Granger ordered</u> the final enforcement of the <u>Emancipation Proclamation</u> in <u>Texas</u>. In 2021, June 19th, known as Juneteenth, was recognized as a federal holiday to commemorate the end of slavery in the United States.

Highland Baptist member and Anti-Racism co-lead Missy Smith is a co-organizer for the Jeffersonville Juneteenth Block Party. This second annual event will be held on Friday, June 14 from 10:00 AM-9:00 PM on Michigan Avenue. The Juneteenth Block Party will promote the Black/African American history of Southern Indiana, educate the public about the importance of Juneteenth, and highlight the positive impact of the local African American culture. This event further allows opportunities for the full and inclusive community to learn and celebrate Black history, engage in commerce with local businesses, craft vendors, and local artists. Plus, there will be bounce houses, great food, and great music!
