Change To This Sunday's Schedule, August 18

With the travel and parking challenges anticipated by this weekend's Ironman Triathlon, and with ongoing challenges related to the new HVAC system, we are altering this Sunday's schedule.

There will be NO Bible Study Classes, and there will be ONE worship service at 10:15 AM in Fellowship Hall. We will livestream the worship service as usual.

For those who plan to attend worship in-person, there are two things to be aware of. One is that LMPD will be directing traffic across the race route and depending on the number of runners and the number of cars attempting to cross the route you will need to add 15 to 30 minutes to your drive time to the church. The second note is that there is no parking on Cherokee Road (or any other street that is part of the race route). We assume that some of our neighbors may park in our lots on Sunday, so parking may be tight. Procter Eubank Nominated to Serve as Honor Deacon




When the deacons met in July, one of our tasks was to nominate our next Honor Deacon. We were looking for someone who has served at least two full terms as Deacon, and shown exemplary leadership, service, Christian maturity, and wisdom over a period of at least 15 years having a profound impact on the life of Highland.

The deacons are pleased to announce our recommendation for Honor Deacon: Procter Eubank. Procter began attending Highland in 1950, when he was just two years old. Procter was baptized in 1958 at the age of 10. Procter graduated from Atherton High School and Western Kentucky University. He is also a former statistician for the U.S. Census Bureau. Procter has served EIGHT terms as deacon and has served as chair of deacons twice. Procter is also an active member of the Senior Adults (also known as The Cream of the Crop) and has served the church in numerous other ways as well, including serving on various ministry groups as well as being a greeter. Nominations Needed

This is a very busy season in the life of our church, and we need to identify folks who will provide leadership for two different groups:

- 1. Leadership Team for Strategic Planning
- 2. Ministry Council

Below are two articles focusing on the needs of these groups. Ballots to be used in the nomination process will be available on Sunday. The ballot will be two-sided, one side for nominations to the Ministry Council and the other side for nominations for the Strategic Planning Leadership Team.

Mission, Vision, and Values

Prior to the pandemic, HBC engaged in a strategic planning process; that process brought forth carefully crafted statements related to our Mission, Vision, and Values. It was the initial step of a process that would result in a 3-5 year plan. Thanks to a grant received by the <u>Center for Congregational Health</u> (CCH), which covers most of the costs, we now have the opportunity to take that next step.

Over the weekend of October 18-20, a representative from the Center for Congregational Health will visit Highland to begin a congregational discernment process with us over the following 6-8 months. The goal of this work is to explore how our current ministries align with our mission, vision, and values and to develop a strategic mission and ministry plan for Highland's future.

The Ministry Council will form a lay leadership team to work with our consultant from the Center for Congregational Health to facilitate and lead this process at Highland. We are seeking your input and requesting nominations of people to serve on this team from the fall of 2024 to the spring of 2025. We hope to have representation from across the diversity of the congregation. We are seeking people who are good listeners, open-minded, actively engaged in Highland, and invested in the work of Love that we share. You are invited to submit up to five names to serve on the leadership team to be considered by the Ministry Council. Please turn in ballots through the offering plate by Sunday, August 25.

Even with a leadership team guiding us in this process, this is congregational work, and we will need everyone's voice involved to reflect the diversity of our community of faith. Please save the date for the weekend of October 18-20, and we will share more information about the events of that weekend as details become available.

Living Beautifully with Uncertainty and Change: Pema Chödrön and the 3 Commitments



Pema Chödrön, an 87-year-old American Buddhist nun, lives and teaches in Nova Scotia. She wonders, "How can we relax and have a genuine, passionate relationship with the fundamental uncertainty, the groundlessness, of being human?...Discomfort arises from all of our efforts to put ground under our feet, to realize our dream of constant okayness...When we embrace the groundlessness of our situation and relax into its dynamic quality, that's called awakening to our true nature, to our fundamental goodness."

Retreat attenders will look to Pema Chödrön's teaching about the three commitments that lead to a deep experience of freedom. We will also consider a few Christian theologians who affirm our groundedness in God. Join us on this experience of collective wondering, tangible practice, and mutual efforts to embrace human groundlessness while loving a grounded God.



Rev. Dr. Lauren Jones Mayfield and Rev. Dr. Tyler D. Mayfield will co-lead the retreat. Lauren serves as the Interim Director of Field Education at Louisville Seminary, where Tyler also works as the Interim Dean and Professor of Old Testament.


