Update from Finance Ministry Group

Greetings from the Finance Ministry Group. We gave an update at the QCC on Sunday and wanted to share some of the important numbers with you today. In last week's newsletter we highlighted the successful end of 2024 for the operational budget with income exceeding expenses. Hooray!

Today, we will focus on the Sacred Space campaign. As you can see in the attached graph, the total project costs are likely to be ~\$3.8 million. After expected tax credits, the congregation will need to raise \$2.8 million. So far we have received \$1,405,844 and have \$647,260 in outstanding pledges. Thank you so much for your generous gifts!! Assuming all pledges are met, we will need to receive an additional \$746,896 in contributions for this project.

February Children's Bible Study and Music Teacher Appreciation Month



The Empathic God: A Book Presentation and Discussion in Three Parts



Frank Woggon's book *The Empathic God: A Clinical Theology of At-onement* (Fortress Press, 2024) constructs a reinterpretation of the Christian narrative of salvation from the clinical perspective of a spiritual care practitioner, utilizing case studies and interdisciplinary dialogue to suggest a faithful Christian practice of participating in God's ongoing work of salvation. 
Financial Focus


