The Empathic God: A Book Presentation and Discussion in Three Parts - Postponed Until Further Notice



Frank Woggon's book *The Empathic God: A Clinical Theology of At-onement* (Fortress Press, 2024) constructs a reinterpretation of the Christian narrative of salvation from the clinical perspective of a spiritual care practitioner, utilizing case studies and interdisciplinary dialogue to suggest a faithful Christian practice of participating in God's ongoing work of salvation. Join Frank Woggon as he discusses the argument and central themes of his book in three presentation sessions:

February 12: The Shadow of the Cross: A Problematic Atonement

February 19: Shame, Empathy, and the Human Condition

February 26: Practicing At-onement: How the Empathic God-event Calls Upon Us

Rev. Frank Woggon, PhD, BCC is the director of Chaplaincy Services at UofL Health, an ACPE Certified Clinical Educator, and Assistant Clinical Professor of Medicine at the University of Louisville. He is married to Kelley, and they are long-time members of Crescent Hill Baptist Church.


Cream of the Crop Potluck Luncheon Next Tuesday

Financial Focus




As we move forward into 2025, please remember contributions can be debited automatically from your checking account. They can also be processed using your credit or debit card. Note that
