Faithful Giving Season Begins

As we move into the season of Faithful Giving, and as ministers and lay leaders are formulating Highland's Ministry Plan (aka "Budget") for next year, I want to say a brief word about commitments to giving during an interim period.

As most of you know, my role at Highland is defined as 20-28 hours per week, and as you know, with Justin's departure, there will be an interim person serving in a less than full-time role. When you stir in that Jim England's role is defined as "interim," it would be reasonable to think, when considering one's commitment to giving to Highland's ministries in 2026, "The needs of the church are less right now in an interim period, so maybe I can kind of cruise on my giving."

It's true that Highland's personnel expenditures are lower right now than they will be after a new pastor comes and other ministers are then hired in permanent roles. But, please bear one thing in mind: Any pastor considering coming to Highland will be provided with your 2026 Ministry Plan (budget) numbers, and they will not be looking at those figures through the lens of an interim period. They will be asking themselves, "Is this church capable of supporting the complement of permanent ministers required to achieve their mission?"

And here's the other thing you need to remember. There are two parts to a pastor search: 1. The church finds someone they feel is called to come help lead the church; 2. That person has to agree to come and serve. All this is to say, as you begin thinking about your level of ministry support for next year, please think of it in terms of a level of support that will fill the winds of Highland's sails once a new pastor comes, not just during this interim period.

It's a pleasure serving you during this transitional period!
