




Join Us for the Senior Adult Mini-Retreat on November 18

Highland Begins Partnership with the Louisville Solidarity Project

We were so fortunate to hear from Dr. Mario Ransan about his work with the Louisville Solidarity Project last Tuesday, and to learn the way that the community is coming together to serve those who are affected by the current moment. This project collects needed items and shuttles them where they are needed using nothing but willing folks. Highland has named itself a willing partner, and will be collecting donations

as long as the need exists. The Anti-Racism Team has a large list of items that are being collected for local high schoolers, and if you want a copy of the long list feel free to reach out to any member of our team. Right now we are going to focus on collecting the items that are most requested: dried beans, bags of rice, diapers, and menstrual pads. Please deposit donations in the boxes outside of the choir room.

The project also needs drivers to shuttle the items from school to school and other locations. Please reach out to me if you are willing to transport donations. There will be folks to help load and unload in most cases, and requires nothing larger than a typical car/passenger vehicle.



Work Resumes on the Sacred Space HVAC Project

This Monday work resumed on replacement of the two 10-ton Heat Pumps beneath the sanctuary. You will recall that the incorrect units were ordered and installed by one of the subcontractors, and the replacement units are being installed this week. This process represents another significant step forward in completing the project. (The pictures below show new hardware being unloaded from the delivery truck and then being moved into the building. The final picture shows the temporarily empty mechanical room beneath the sanctuary, before the new heat pumps are moved into position.)


