## Financial Information and Vote on the 2026 Budget

Greetings Highland,

We met at the Quarterly Church Conference last Wednesday to present the proposed 2026 Budget. Here are the highlights of the discussion:

For 2025, our year-to-date expenses and income/giving are matching very closely our expectations. We are currently at a \$83,847 deficit of income-to-expenses. For 2026, we have received \$722,276 in pledges from 117 giving units. We are expecting a few more to come in, likely totaling ~\$775,000.

As for the budget, we are expecting income to be similar from 2025 to 2026. Giving is holding steady and our other sources of income are little changed: with the exception that we are making more interest income from the bank and we have lost our rental income after selling the Foree House.

Expenses for the 2026 budget are little changed as well. Most of our ministries were able to keep steady/flat for this upcoming year. Here a few of the notable changes: Worship ministry has increased due to rising costs of the sign language service; Technology and Facilities have increased to match expected demand; the Sacred Space interest payments will decrease significantly! Personnel budget is overall lower. Some factors decreased their budget: not filling the associate pastor position and having interim roles for head pastor and youth pastor for part of the year. While other factors increased their budget: staff salary market adjustments and COLA's and rising costs of medical insurance.

Combined, here are the final numbers for the 2026 budget: total income of \$1,108,500. Total expenses of \$1,195,515 for an expected deficit of \$87,015. We also gave a Sacred Space update. We will give a detailed update in an upcoming newsletter.



#### A Note from Chris

Our friends at The Alliance of Baptists asked pastors to reflect upon how their congregations were responding to the turmoil and cruelty in today's society. Here's what I sent.

As an interim pastor at Highland Baptist Church in Louisville, I've been figuring out the church at the same time they, like all of us, have been trying to figure out how to respond faithfully to what's going on in our country right now. Here is what I have observed.

- People are grieving. When I have said from the pulpit any form of, "I know these are hard times," I see nodding heads and can sense tears in the corners of eyes.
- People are learning. As rights are being threatened, people within the church are staying informed and engaging with others seeking to protect those whose rights are threatened.
- People are resolute. Convictions that were strong before the presidential election are stronger now. I have seen, however, how important it has been, especially in sermons, for the congregation to hear those convictions passionately claimed and proclaimed.
- · People are seeking ways to convert worry and anger into action. Highland has a proud history of ministering in and with our city, but I sense there is even greater passion to do this in these days.
- At the same time people are leaning into serving and advocating in the community, I sense them leaning into and upon worship. Etched in stone at the back of the sanctuary are the words, "Be ye doers of the word, and not hearers only." Even so, we all sense in this season how doubly important it is to worship and to heal before we go back out to live those words another week.

In short, I am proud of how Highland is responding. As someone who served as a pastor for over twentyfive years, I have seen how stress and struggles tend to reveal the essence of families--for good or for ill. Highland is no more perfect than any other church, but one can see in it a caring and faithful heart as it


