Voting Protocol for Members and Voting Affiliates for Pastor Candidate

In-Person Voting Members and voting affiliates may cast their votes in person during any of the three scheduled worship services:

- **Friday Church**
- **Sunday 8:45 Service**
- **Sunday 11:15 Service**

Electronic Voting Eligibility Folks who are traveling, homebound, or in continuing care—and are therefore unable to attend the Sunday services in person—may participate in the vote during the designated "Call Sunday" hours (**9:00 AM – 12:00 PM**) via electronic ballot. To qualify for this option, members must:

1. **Attend** at least one in-person or virtual meeting with the candidate during the call week.
2. **Request** to have their vote recorded electronically by providing their email address to a member of the Pastor Search Committee during the in-person or virtual meeting.


Once attendance is verified, the member will be registered for an electronic voting opportunity that will remain open exclusively (via Survey Monkey) during the Sunday service hours.






