West End School Receives Donations

The West End School ("WES") is "a scholarship-based independent school serving scholars in Pre-K through 8th grade." Adrienne Dubins, WES Admissions, Volunteer and Development Head, and her assistant, Robin Thomas, a volunteer herself, were guest speakers at the February Jean Janes mission group meeting. One of the organization's top needs is raising awareness about WES, thus this article. Adrienne and Robin are pictured below with donations received from the Jean Janes group.



WES is located on Virginia Avenue. Its oldest building is 101 years old and was originally known as the Virginia Avenue Colored School. WES was founded in 2005 with an initial enrollment of three middle school boys; it has grown to serving 140 scholars, including girls. The ONLY cost to parents is a small fee for Pre-K through 5th grade for after school care and for uniforms; **tuition is free to all scholars!** WES also provides weekday boarding for middle school boys. The organization's focus isn't solely on education - it seeks to develop the whole individual, promoting a purposeful life and contributing to the community. Recently, WES received 260 applications for 52 scholar openings!

WES relies heavily on private donations, with its only government funding covering school meals. Aside from donations and raising awareness, WES needs help providing dinners for middle school scholars and school supplies. To learn more, [visit the WES website here](#).
