- End-of-Year Giving—You may remember that in December, we anticipated that end-of-year expenses could significantly exceed our income. We are overjoyed to share that Highland boldly stepped up to the challenge, and we ended the year having received \$1,238,262 for our ministry budget, in addition to \$824,616 for the Sacred Space Campaign. That's over \$2 million dollars toward creating a world where justice and Love are abundant. Thank you, Highland, for your faithfulness and generosity! Unfortunately, we still ended the year \$55,809 behind our expenses, although this number is not nearly as high as it could have been. You will be hearing more feedback from the Finance Ministry Group on these topics at the Quarterly Church Conference on February 4.
