HIGHLAND BAPTIST CHURCH FIRST SUNDAY IN LENT February 18, 2024 8:45 and 11:15 a.m. The season of Lent is 40 weekdays, beginning on Ash Wednesday and ending the day before Easter. These 40 days represent the time when Jesus was in the wilderness praying and resisting the devil's temptations. Using the life of Jesus as our guide, we pray for God's forgiveness and guidance to initiate change in us and move toward a greater understanding of who Jesus is and what we can do to be like him. You might notice that during the season of Lent, symbols crafted of common things drawn from the earth, such as clay and wood, replace the resplendent silver symbols on the communion table. This change, along with a plentiful use of burlap fabric, helps create an outward shift toward penitence and meditation. Purple is the predominant color of Lent as seen on the cross and worn by the ministers.

One way Highland is celebrating Black History Month is by hearing the voices of black musicians in our worship. Today we highlight:

- Moses George Hogan was an American composer and arranger of choral music. He was best known for his settings of spirituals. Hogan was a pianist, conductor, and arranger of international renown. Born in New Orleans, Hogan lived with five siblings and his parents, who gave their children a passion for music. He was an accomplished pianist by the age of nine. He earned a Bachelor of Music from Oberlin Conservatory, and did graduate studies at the Juilliard School. Sadly, Hogan died in 2003, at the age of 45, from a brain tumor. Over his short life time he published 88 arrangements for voice.
- John W. Work III was born June 15, 1901 in Tullahoma, Tennessee, to a family of professional musicians. His grandfather was a church choir director in Nashville and his father was a singer, folksong collector and professor of music, Latin, and history at Fisk University. Work received his B.A. degree in 1923 and then attended the Institute of Musical Art in New York City (now the Juilliard School of Music). He also received an M.A. degree from Columbia University and a B.Mus. degree from Yale University. He returned to Fisk and began teaching in 1927. He was chairperson of the Fisk University Department of Music, where he conducted the Fisk Jubilee Singers for ten years. He was a gifted author, lyricist, choral conductor, educator, and ethnomusicologist. As composer, he wrote music for full orchestra, piano, chamber ensemble, violin and organ, but his greatest output was in choral and solo-voice music. He was awarded an honorary doctorate from Fisk University in 1963, three years before his death in 1967.
