We appreciate the musical leadership of the Choristers and Children's Handbell Choir in today's worship service and are thankful for the support of their families and Wednesday night music teachers.

One way Highland is celebrating Black History Month is by hearing the voices of black musicians in our worship. Today we highlight:

- Uzee Brown, Jr., a native of Cowpens, South Carolina, and now a resident of Atlanta, Georgia, worked closely as a student and colleague for almost twenty years with Dr. Wendell P. Whalum (Director of the Morehouse Glee Club and acclaimed educator, arranger, and lecturer of Black music). In addition to teaching at Morehouse College, Brown is a noted opera singer, composer, arranger, and orchestrator. He holds a doctoral degree from the University of Michigan. The postlude, *March of Heritage*, was commissioned for the inauguration of Dr. Walter Massey, eighth-president of Morehouse College, February 16, 1996.
- Stacey V. Gibbs is a prolific and highly sought-after composer-arranger and clinician. Best known for arrangements of spirituals, he is highly acclaimed for his ability to infuse new energy into familiar works without sacrificing their authenticity or power. He currently has over 200 published arrangements for choral ensembles. His music was performed at the 57th Inaugural Service for President Barack Obama and family. He attended Kentucky State University where he served as student conductor. He currently resides in Detroit, Michigan.
- Florence Price (1887-1953) was an American classical composer, pianist, organist, and music teacher. Born in Little Rock, Arkansas, Price was educated at the New England Conservatory of Music, and was active in Chicago from 1927 until her death in 1953. Price is noted as the first African-American woman to be recognized as a symphonic composer, and the first to have a composition played by a major orchestra. Price composed over 300 works: four symphonies, four concertos, as well as choral works, art songs, chamber music, and music for solo instruments.
