This Pride Sunday focuses on the music of Calvin Hampton. Born in 1938, Hampton was a prolific composer, organist, and choral conductor. He served as organist and choirmaster at Calvary Episcopal Church in Manhattan, New York from 1963-83. His "Fridays at Midnight" organ recital series, held there from 1974 to 1983, was one of the most renowned and widely attended organ recital series in American history. Hampton was particularly known for his hymn tunes and creative treatment of hymns. Many of his own tunes had complex and rhythmic accompaniments that he refused to simplify. Four of his tunes (DE TAR, LUKKASON, MACDOUGALL, AND ST. HELENA) are featured in *The Hymnal 1982*.
