Today in Worship

Phrases from today's hymn of praise, *Christ, Whose Glory Fills the Sky*, will guide us toward images that embody segments of our worship service — praise, confession, proclamation, and response.

One way Highland celebrates Black History Month is by hearing the voices of black musicians in our worship:

- André Thomas is a living composer originally from Wichita, Kansas. His mother cleaned buses for Trailways and sang in the church initiating his love of music. He was primarily self-taught at piano until jr. high when he began taking lessons at Wichita State University. He eventually earned his DMA and began teaching at Florida State until he retired in 2019. He continues to lead clinics, conduct choirs, and compose.
- Many of you may wonder about the phrase we sing today, "Hold up the Baptist finger, hold up the Baptist hand"! According to legend, during slavery days when the masters took their enslaved persons with them to public gatherings, the enslaved would always sit in the balcony. When one had to go to the bathroom or wanted to be excused for any reason, they would hold their hand up and keep it up until their master acknowledged that they saw their hand and gave them permission to leave or in other words "excused them to leave." After the enslaved person was given permission to leave, they would hold up one finger as they were leaving to inform anyone who saw them leave that they had been excused.
- The origin of *This Little Light of Mine* is unclear but may have appeared in the 1920's as an American gospel song. One of the earliest recordings was by a black woman, Doris McMurray, who was imprisoned in Texas. During the Civil Rights Movement, the hopeful lyrics were part of Freedom Singing when large groups of protesters sang as a form of resistance to deescalate tensions.
