





Missions

The Mission to North America Disaster Response (MNADR) team exists to aid churches when disaster strikes their communities. Arklie Hooten, MNADR Director, said they began preparing to respond to Hurricane Helene days before the storm even made landfall on September 26 near the mouth of the Aucilla River in northern Florida. PCA first responder teams were deployed on September 29 in FL, GA, and SC, including professional-grade chainsaw teams from the Gulf Coast Presbytery and Wildwood PCA. Flood mitigation tools and supplies were loaded at the Rome, GA warehouse enroute to worksites so teams could respond with urgency and grace. Preparations for storm season have been ongoing for several months. MNADR staff expanded their training room at the Response Center in Rome, they sought refills of their flood buckets and hygiene kits after exhausting their supplies during recent disasters in Houston, and they purchased ten new high-quality chainsaws and accessories. They also completed many seasonal tasks at their Rome warehouse and Dallas depot, including maintenance of their mission-critical specialty trailers that contain mobile bunkhouses and showers.

Please pray for the following:

- -strength and safety for the men and women helping those affected by Hurricane Helene
- -PCA churches to minister God's grace to those in need during times of disasters
- -wisdom for MNADR leadership in knowing where and how to deploy resources
