



#### Missions


North Care Women's Clinic is a local non-profit Christian ministry offering God's help, hope, and healing to people experiencing an unexpected pregnancy. Their mission is to compassionately empower individuals to make healthy and informed decisions regarding their pregnancies, and to be a leader in promoting positive sexual values. In 2023, North Care saw 584 clients. Seventy-eight percent of their pregnancy clients were at risk for abortion, and seventy percent of those clients had their babies. They had a twenty-seven percent increase in number of ultrasounds and a three hundred percent increase in Spanish speaking clients since adding a staff translator. It is becoming evident that there is a significant population of women in the church who have had an abortion. Unless they are able to face the truth of the abortion and understand that God offers forgiveness in Christ, their abortion will often continue to haunt them and affect many areas of their lives and relationships. North Care will be forming a new abortion healing group beginning March 18 and running for eight weeks. This group will offer freedom in a supportive community where women can honestly and confidentially share their stories with other women in a biblically nurturing environment.

Please continue to pray for this ministry and the clients that they serve.
