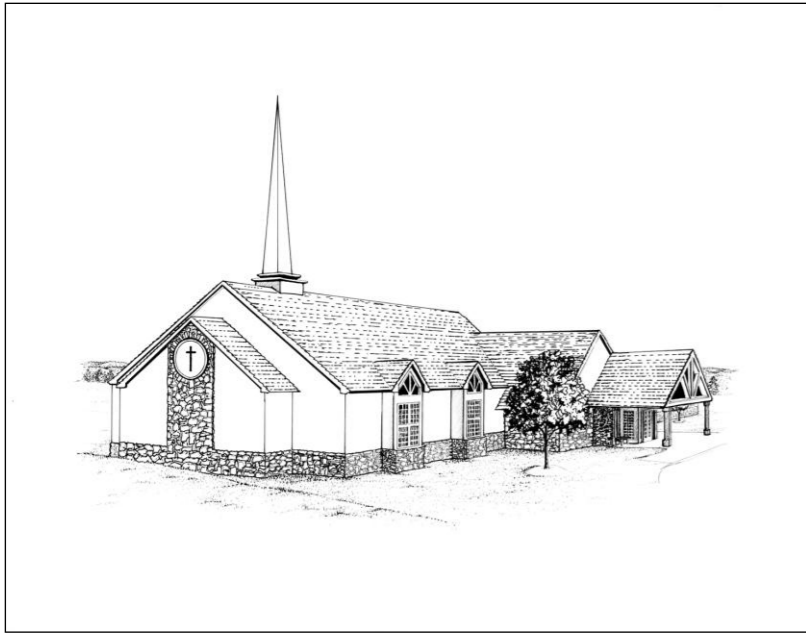
Missions
