

Missions

Shibu Oommen and his wife, Mary, are serving with Evangelism Explosion International. They are also founders of India Village Mission (IVM) which seeks to address the spiritual, physical, and educational needs of women and children in areas of India where people are destitute and ignored. IVM is thrilled to announce the launch of their new Tailoring Centre, designed specifically to empower individuals from economically disadvantaged backgrounds. Their focus is on uplifting women, providing them with essential sewing skills that open avenues for self-employment and financial independence. IVM is also planning to start an Envelope Making Unit that aims to provide women with skills that can lead to selfsustenance. During the training at both of these programs the staff will interact and provide spiritual counseling to the women. At IVM's pre-school program, dedicated teachers focus on academic skills and instilling values that encourage the children to grow into responsible members of society. They are excited to report a tremendous improvement in the academic performance of the students and an increased confidence and enthusiasm for learning.


Please pray for the following:
