After much reflection and prayer, it has been decided that Flavien will accept the invitation to minister to the persecuted church in a Far East country. Beginning in 2025, he will start traveling yearly to train the leaders of a large network of churches there. It will be both humbling and exciting to be part of such strategic work.

Hosanna, their younger daughter who loves ballet dancing, has a fractured toe and is looking at several months of limited activity. Inyange was granted the status of permanent resident, and they will be filing paperwork for green card applications for the girls and then for Flavien.
