

Missions

Jim Rich serves as a Chaplain at ACTS Spring House Estates under the care of the Presbyterian and Reformed Commission on Chaplains and Military Personnel (PRCC).

He ministers to the residents of the senior living community through weekly worship services, Bible studies, and spiritual counseling. In addition to this work, Jim will also be assuming the position of regional senior Chaplain where he will be supporting the nine other civilian Chaplains in the Northeast region of ACTS.

The latest edition of the PRCC Chaplain Prayer Guide and Newsletter includes an article by Chaplain Rich entitled "Caring for Caregivers of Those with Cognitive Decline."

The article addresses the often-overlooked impact that the cognitive decline of a loved one can have on the life and health of the caregivers and offers them help in viewing these difficult circumstances from a biblical perspective. Spring House Estates runs a small group specifically for spouses who are caregivers, which allows them to receive support and meet others with similar needs and burdens. Chaplain Rich welcomes prayer that he will be an effective shepherd as he assumes the new senior Chaplain responsibilities.
