GOD:

David and Ruth are in Southeast Asia beginning their new ministry assisting churches as they explore, establish, and expand campus ministries across the region. They have spent much of their time orienting themselves—learning their way around, getting a bank account, visiting churches, and meeting pastors and neighbors. In May they had an opportunity to join a group of visiting college students from the US. They visited a Christian fellowship at a local university, a Hindu shrine, and a colonial village and heard a Christian from Yemen tell his story. One of the most interesting experiences was a visit to an Islamic university where they had an Interfaith Dialogue with students and faculty. A local pastor was eager to introduce the American students to Asian food, so he produced a Fear Factor Competition. It was a huge hit as four teams tried to win by eating foods such as chicken entrails and feet, stinky beans, fermented shrimp, and Durian, a fruit which is banned in hotels due to its strong smell. David and Ruth were pleased when their twenty-four boxes of household goods finally arrived at the end of May. Their condo is now taking shape as a place where they can comfortably live, work, and host guests.
