## LEARN THE WORD

### 1 John 1:8-9

*If we say we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us. If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness.*

- The Israelites made a bad choice when they said they wanted a man to be king instead of God.
- Saul was chosen to be king, but he made bad choices and did not obey God completely.

## WHAT YOU HEARD IN THE WORD

## OUTWORD FOR FAMILY DISCUSSION

Ask your child these questions from today's lesson:

1. Was it okay for Saul to offer a sacrifice instead of waiting for Samuel?

**Answer:** No.

2. What did Saul keep alive when he should have destroyed all the Amalekites and all their things?

**Answer:** He kept King Agag and some animals alive.

3. What is a consequence?

**Answer:** Something bad that happens because of a bad choice.

**Activity:** King Saul made some bad choices and disobeyed God. Use the numbers to color in the picture.
