A NOTE FROM PASTOR KARLA

When my family and I were traveling in the Black Hills of South Dakota this summer we had the opportunity to ride horses. After a vast Google search throughout Montana, Idaho, and Wyoming, I finally landed on an outfitter in Custer State Park that would allow my five year old to ride. Even though it was only an hour trail ride, it felt like a real western experience as we rode through flowing creeks, up steep hills, and around tall trees. My five year old sat alone on the tallest horse in the group, hanging on for dear life, while his horse maneuvered quite gracefully through the winding path. In the end, it was the participants who rode horses that stayed in formation, following the horse directly in front of them, that had the better experience. Those with horses who wandered off the path or stopped to graze on grass in the fields were consistently preoccupied with survival and missed the beauty of the surroundings.



This school year our theme is "Choosing Unity." Just like the horses in my trail ride at Custer State Park, life is calmer, more beautiful, and filled with more joy when we are all working together as one with a common purpose. Many times in our world today, unity feels like an impossible ideal. When you turn on the news or check your social media feed, more often than not, your ears and eyes are filled with stories and images of strife and contention. We have lost the ability to listen to those who experience life differently than we do and, as a result, we cling to those who reinforce our narrow perspectives.

God desires more for His Church. God wants us to talk about our differences, learn from one another and, in that learning, grow closer together.

This month, in addition to the launch of our regular fall programming, there are several workshops being offered at the church intended to teach us how to engage with those who think differently than we do. It is my hope that a large portion of our community participates in the two main events being offered on September 14 and 29. The skills we will learn and practice will strengthen our relationships with one another and help us better understand those in our own families, schools, places of work, and in our broader world.

Please join me as we seek to choose unity this year!

The project remains committed to providing a modern preschool, remodeled meeting spaces, and second floor elevator access, within the Generation to Generation budget.

Transform Our World Mission Group Lead Elder Bob Lemke presented the annual grant distribution funding request, listing the 18 mission partners PLCPC financially supports around the world. He led a discussion considering the process used to select our partners and determine grants. Session approved the request and prayed for the missions, and our Mission Group.




